

Saving Output to a File (Using Codeblocks or Dev-C++)

Saving Your Output to a File

To save the output to a file,

- a. Right-click in the top bar of the output window and choose Edit | Select All.
- b. Then right click in the bar again and choose Edit | Copy.
- c. Go back into the Dev-C++ editor and select File | New | Source File.
- d. In the new window, right-click and select Paste.
- e. Then select “File | Save as” to save and name the file.
 - i. In the window that pops up, the bottom fill-in box is labelled “Save as type”. Click on the arrow to the right of that box and scroll down to “All files (*.*)” and click on it. (If you do not do this step, the extension .cpp will be attached automatically to the end of the file name you choose.)
 - ii. In the box labelled “File name,” type the name of the file with the extension .out or .txt (for example, prog0.out or prog0.txt).
 - iii. Click “Save”.

These steps produce a file which you can attach to an email or print.

Alternatively, for steps 6c to the end, you can do this:

- c. Open Notepad (right click on the desktop and select New | Text document).
- d. In the new window, right-click and select Paste.
- e. Then select “File | Save as” to save and name the file.
 - i. In the box labelled “File name,” type the name of the file. It will automatically be given the extension .txt (for example, prog0.txt).
 - ii. Click “Save”.
